Herefordshire Public Green Spaces Community Grant Scheme?

This grant supports Herefordshire Council's aim to dispose of non-strategic assets. This small and limited fund will support Town and Parish Councils in Herefordshire to have an opportunity to demonstrate that they have the ability to maintain and enhance a green space with the view to a long term asset transfer. The scheme supports projects that have community involvement and impact. Where a lengthsman scheme is in place this grant will aim to provide a complementary opportunity.

Types of projects that could be supported:

- Equipment to maintain green spaces
- Appropriate protective equipment and equipment maintenance tools
- Pay for contracted services to maintain green assets

Who can apply?

How will I know if our project is eligible?

Each project should:

- Take place and benefit people in Herefordshire
- Demonstrate good value for money
- Involve the community
- Improve or maintain public green spaces (excludes verges along the trunk roads and motorways in the county (A40/M50/A49 apart from the stretch of the A49 in Hereford from Holmer to Grafton)
- Clearly demonstrate how safety risk will be assessed and mitigated
- Clearly demonstrate how the project will be maintained and be sustainable in the future

Climate Change

Herefordshire Council has committed to take a major step to minimise the council's impact on the environment.

At the cabinet meeting held on Thursday 26 September, elected members agreed to:

- Accelerate a reduction of emissions and aspire to become carbon neutral by 2030/31.
- Deliver an updated carbon management plan and associated action plan for Council emissions by April 2020.
- Work with strategic partners, residents and local organisations to develop a revised countywide CO2 reduction strategy aspiring for carbon neutrality by 2030.
- Use 100% renewably sourced energy where this provides the best carbon reduction return on investment.

Smartwater

The Police and Crime Commissioner is looking to address burglary/theft issues within towns/villages/rural areas. There is an offer of support by way of introducing the We Don't Buy Crime initiative which is having very positive effects on crime figures in the West Mercia area.

There are approx. 70 villages and towns on board already with the scheme which not only acts to protect belongings but prevent burglaries, convict criminals and brings communities together to fight this form of crime and reduce fear.

What is Smartwater?

A Water based solution with a unique forensic code. It's made invisible to the naked eye but can be seen under UV light. Only a small amount needs to be applied to an item and left to dry and then the property is marked. Each bottle is unique which enables the police/Smartwater to identify the owner of property and therefore return it if stolen, link it to any associated crime and prosecute offenders.

West Mercia Police officers now have a UV light to detect the presence of

Smartwater when arresting or stopping and searching suspects. Second hand stores are also being offered UV lights which they can use to establish whether property is marked and possibly stolen.

What is a 'We Don't Buy Crime' area?

We Don't Buy Crime towns and villages are where every residential property has the opportunity to mark their possessions free of charge. When 70% of a target area has been registered, street signage is displayed (as in the image below). It has been identified that a 70% saturation rate is the appropriate coverage of an area to deliver deductions. The purpose of the initiative is to let potential offenders know that if they commit crime they are likely to get caught and will not have the opportunity to profit.

Blue Badges help people to more readily access services and other facilities and in doing so increases independence. Their use is also shown to improve the health and wellbeing of individual badge holders and, where relevant, also that of their carer.

A total of 8,207 people in Herefordshire currently hold and use a Blue Badge and approximately 300 badges per month are granted to Herefordshire residents who have a disability that severely impacts their mobility.
