Old Gore Ward – Herefordshire Council

City bypass and southern link road

Herefordshire Council cabinet have approved setting aside £360,000 of reserve funding to pay for the review into the plans for a city bypass and southern link road. The funding will be moved from the council's financial resilience earmarked reserve to meet the review costs of the Hereford Transport and South Wye Transport packages.

Transport and infrastructure cabinet member, John Harrington, decided to pause and review both schemes after Herefordshire Independent, Green Party and Its Our County councillors formed coalition administration last year.

Councillor Harrington confirmed the review programme of the Hereford Transport and South Wye transport packages earlier this month. Officers will now be authorised to complete the work within a total budget of £451,000. The reviews have a deadline of July 31, 2020.

Southern Link Road and proposed western bypass

There is the continued prevarication of the Council's administration for the southern link road and western bypass. The latest announcement, following the virtual suspension of working on the two projects last July, is to have a consultation on options reporting back in July.

Not surprisingly the funding allocated via the local Marches Enterprise partnership has been pulled on the assessment that Herefordshire Council will not be starting these projects in the next 12 months. The Marches LEP are to start the business of 'clawing back' an initial £3.8m given to Herefordshire Council to enable the project. I suspect the administration will blame the Marches LEP for pulling the funds but let's be clear the administration's would appear to be employing delaying actions is a deliberate attempt to crash the projects with no valid alternatives worked up.

This time of year the council sets its budget for the forthcoming year. The Government settlement was more generous than anticipated including a grant for the extra cost of delivering rural services of 5.1 million. Herefordshire Council finances are in a strong position.

County phosphate issue

Water pollution has forced Herefordshire Council to put planning applications on hold across a large part of the county. Phosphate levels in the River Lugg catchment area are so high

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that the local authority has placed new development proposals on hold until it finds a way forward.

The Lugg catchment area in Herefordshire spreads from the Welsh border near Kington as far east as Bromyard and from the northern outskirts of Hereford to almost as far north as Orleton.

Several years ago, the council launched a nutrient management plan to minimise the amount of pollution in the county's rivers. But Natural England now says it isn't doing enough to address the problem

There is currently in place a suspension of all residential and many business growth applications in North Herefordshire due to the phosphate problem. The situation looks like continuing for most if not all this year with serious implications for many local businesses and residents.

River Wye and Lugg Natural Flood Management Project

Below is the January's update on the River Wye and Lugg Natural Flood Management Project. A Defra funded partnership project which is working with landowners, farmers and communities within seven catchment areas, looking at the ways we can work together to reduce flood risk to downstream communities.

Novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV) - what you need to know

A coronavirus is a type of virus. As a group, coronaviruses are common across the world.

Typical symptoms of coronavirus include fever and a cough that may progress to a severe pneumonia causing shortness of breath and breathing difficulties.

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Generally, coronavirus can cause more severe symptoms in people with weakened immune systems, older people, and those with long term conditions like diabetes, cancer and chronic lung disease.

What is the current risk level to the UK?

Two patients in England, who are members of the same family, have tested positive for novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV). The patients are receiving specialist NHS care, and we are using tried and tested infection control procedures to prevent further spread of the virus.

It is reported that the NHS is extremely well-prepared and used to managing infections and we are already working rapidly to identify any contacts the patients had, to prevent further spread. Public Health England have been preparing for UK cases of novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV) and have robust infection control measures in place to respond immediately.

What's the current travel advice?

The Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) advise against all travel to Hubei Province and now advise against all but essential travel to the rest of mainland China (not including Hong Kong and Macao).
